



Conservation, Poverty Alleviation and Community Development Through Tourism in Developing Countries

International Program 1999 to 2002

CRC for Sustainable Tourism's International program (CRCST-INT) aims to support the development of infrastructure and institutional capacity of countries involved in the management of the natural and cultural estate. CRCST-INT has been established to help protected area agencies and the tourism industry in developing countries to build an ecologically and socially sustainable tourism industry. It aims to develop country specific models of sustainable tourism in close cooperation with host nations, which would include the development of research, education and policy frameworks as well as infrastructure for an ecologically and socially sound tourism development. For this purpose it aims to attract suitable investors for models it develops in collaboration with national institutions and Non-Government Organisations (NGO's). CRCST-INT is developing a joint research and education network based on sustainable tourism involving overseas and Australian institutions, NGO's, researchers, managers and students.

With extensive experience in Australia and Asia and a network across Australia's universities and industry, the CRCST-INT is uniquely suited to work in close cooperation with national institutions to pursue its goals. It can do this with an in-depth knowledge of the global tourism industry and a wide experience in all aspects of natural resource management. It works in close cooperation with Australian tertiary institutions and with researchers and institutions from countries in the Asia Pacific region. CRCST-INT seeks to extend its network of programs and

partners in Asia Pacific and to develop long-term relationships and cooperation between the tourism industry, host communities and managers of protected areas.

CRCST-INT plays an increasingly important role in the development of tourism in many Asia Pacific countries through projects in eight Asian countries and in particular Nepal, Bhutan, China and Papua New Guinea. There is great potential for CRCST-INT to develop its capacity as a network to promote the development of a better, more responsible and beneficial tourism industry across the Asia Pacific region that facilitates conservation and community development. This network also offers a potential to work with United Nations, regional organisations (e.g. APEC) and (I)NGO's in the areas of poverty alleviation, conservation, environmental management and community development.

At the forefront of sustainable tourism development is China using tourism as the lead industry to develop its central and western less developed regions that make up almost 3/4 of its land area. It is in this context that the CRCST-INT has established its first permanent presence internationally in Chengdu China, upon invitation from some of its trusted and long-term partners.

Objectives

To pursue these general aims the CRCST-INT will:

- Support a professional culture of collaboration and integration.
